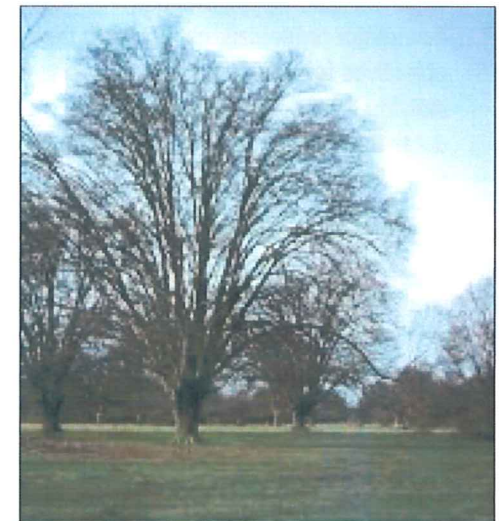

Managing Wildlife in Historic Places



Monday 17 March 2008

With increasing need for joined-up environmental management through conservation plans, environmental management planning and public outreach, wildlife and heritage professionals are increasingly aware of their mutual responsibility to understand and have regard for each other's sphere of interest. This course will seek to provide a broad overview of basic principles and legal obligations pertaining to wildlife and heritage conservation illustrated by practical case studies and the policies and procedures of various organisations involved in managing historic places or advising owners of them.

It will examine four broad themes through a mixture of presentations and discussion sessions:

- an outline of wildlife legislation of particular relevance to heritage managers, with examples of particular issues of potential conflict (such as badgers and scheduled monuments) and possible solutions;
- an outline of heritage and wildlife management practices including both synergies and conflict in conservation requirements;
- how major organisations reconcile their objectives for wildlife and heritage conservation;
- individual case studies examining in more detail how issues have been resolved on a practical basis.

The course will be of particular value to those involved in managing historic places or advising owners of them, from either a wildlife or heritage point of view, and also anyone involved in environmental management in commercial, national agency, local authority, independent and university contexts.
